- Organize a bring and buy sale, either digitally or face to face, in which people can exchange items they no longer need.
- Determine how much waste your school or group generates and where it goes. Design a project to start or expand school or group-wide recycling and composting efforts.
- Have a clothing bank for uniforms or other clothing.
- Have a tools library and re-share/ re-use with your classmates' tools that you don't use anymore, but it is still in a good condition to use.
- Start an up-cycling club.
- Contact your STEAM Mentor to discuss additional waste reduction strategies.

Discussion Points	 How could they apply this thought process to other aspects of their lives? What systems or infrastructure could be put in place to make it easier to avoid single-use items? What are the pros and cons of ownership of items?
